

Important Changes Regarding ImageModeler Frequently Asked Questions

When will Autodesk ImageModeler stop being sold as a stand-alone product?

As of November 2, 2009, licenses of Autodesk® ImageModeler™ 2009 software and ImageModeler 2009 upgrades will no longer be available for purchase as a stand-alone product.

How will this affect me as an existing ImageModeler customer?

As an existing customer, you can continue to use ImageModeler. We will continue to honor our 30-day support policy for new licenses of ImageModeler, and learning resources will remain available on www.autodesk.com/imagemodeler. The ImageModeler [User Forum](#) will also remain active.

Can I still upgrade my older version of ImageModeler?

If you wish to upgrade your existing ImageModeler software licenses or buy additional licenses, you have through November 1, 2009 to do so. Please consult the upgrade pricing section on our [eStore](#).

How will I be able to access ImageModeler technology beginning November 2, 2009?

As of November 2, 2009, you will only be able to obtain a license of ImageModeler 2009 when you purchase a license of Autodesk® 3ds Max® 2010, Autodesk® 3ds Max® Design 2010, or Autodesk® Maya® 2010 software with Autodesk® Subscription. You will then be able to install and use ImageModeler 2009 on your machine associated with the 3ds Max 2010, 3ds Max Design 2010, or Maya 2010 Subscription.
